



## **Ohio governor signs bill on Brent Spence bridge tolls**

CINCINNATI - Ohio Gov. John Kasich has signed legislation to allow tolls on a new bridge over the Ohio River into Kentucky that will replace an overpass deemed "functionally obsolete."

Kasich signed the bill Wednesday at Cincinnati's Paul Brown Stadium. That's adjacent to the 51-year-old Brent Spence Bridge, which spans the river to northern Kentucky.

The bridge carries about 172,000 vehicles a day. The reconstructed bridge would more than double its capacity and address safety and traffic concerns that have caused the National Bridge Inventory to label the Brent Spence as "functionally obsolete."

## **Kasich: Ohio's done its part on Brent Spence Bridge**

Cincinnati - Ohio Gov. John Kasich and state lawmakers sent a clear message to Northern Kentucky about the Brent Spence Bridge project on Wednesday:

*We've done our part – now do yours.*

Kasich came to Paul Brown Stadium and signed into law a bill that will allow for tolls to be collected electronically if a new bridge is ever built.

With the bridge as a backdrop through a large window on the stadium's west side, the Republican governor was joined by several Republican and Democratic state lawmakers who cleared the way for Ohio to be ready to start work on the \$2.6 billion Ohio River bridge replacement and interstate overhaul.
