Executive Order 2013-04K

Directing Expenditure of Fiscal Year 2013 TANF Funds
by the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services

WHEREAS, the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (“TANF”) program is a state program of family assistance, which is provided with state and federal funds, authorized under Title IV-A of the Social Security Act.

WHEREAS, the first purpose of the TANF program is to “provide assistance to needy families so that children may be cared for in their own homes or in the homes of relatives.”

WHEREAS, the second purpose of the TANF program is to “end the dependencies of needy parents on government benefits by promoting job preparation, work, and marriage.”

WHEREAS, the third purpose of the TANF program is to “prevent and reduce the incidence of out-of-wedlock pregnancies and establish annual numerical goals for preventing and reducing the incidence of these pregnancies.”

WHEREAS, the fourth purpose of the TANF program is to “encourage the formation and maintenance of two-parent families.”

WHEREAS, the Governor’s Office of Faith-Based and Community Initiatives (“GOFBCI”) works to reduce poverty in Ohio by serving as a catalyst for effective public-private partnerships aimed at reducing poverty.


NOW, THEREFORE, I, John R. Kasich, Governor of the State of Ohio, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of the State of Ohio and in accordance with Sections 5101.80 and 5101.801 of the Ohio Revised Code, do hereby order and direct that:

1. GOFBCI has been authorized to expend up to \$6,539,371.00 during Fiscal Year 2013 (“FY 2013 Budget”) on TANF-allowable expenses, as stated in Executive Orders 2012-12K and 2013-01K.
2. Of the amounts remaining available to GOFBCI in the FY 2013 Budget, GOFBCI is authorized to allocate funds in the following manner:
 - a. Up to Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) shall be used to partner with Mom’s House in Toledo, Ohio, to provide Early Childhood and Parent Program services.

- b. Up to One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall be divided equally among those of the following thirteen Ohio Foodbanks that participate in this program: Akron-Canton Regional Foodbank, Freestore Foodbank, Cleveland Foodbank, The Foodbank, Inc., Shared Harvest Foodbank, Mid-Ohio Foodbank, West Ohio Foodbank, Southeastern Ohio Foodbank, Second Harvest Foodbank of North Central Ohio, Second Harvest Foodbank of Clark, Champaign, and Logan Counties, Toledo Northwestern Foodbank, Second Harvest Foodbank of the Mahoning Valley, and Seagate Foodbank, to assist them in providing services to low-income, TANF eligible populations.
 - c. Up to Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) of additional funding to the Ohio Association of Foodbanks to increase the amount of food available to at-risk children in the summer months.
 - d. Up to Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) to The Day of Caring 365 to increase the availability of hygiene products for low-income families.
3. The remaining monies for the FY 2013 Budget for GOFBCI shall be used to provide support to programs or organizations that promote the mission of GOFBCI and further one of the four purposes of the TANF program set forth above.
 4. The state, county, and private agencies receiving funds as a result of the Executive Order shall comply with all TANF requirements, including reporting requirements, and timelines as specified in state and federal statutes, federal regulations, state rules, interagency agreements, and any relevant directives from ODJFS.

I signed this Executive Order on 5-23, 2013, in COLUMBUS, Ohio, and it will expire on June 30, 2013.
