Executive Order 2011-14K

The Emergency Amendment of Rules 5101:2-16-30 and 5101:2-16-39 of the Ohio Administrative Code by the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services

WHEREAS, a need for emergency changes in child care rules exists following statutory revisions in Am. Sub. H.B. No. 153 of the 129th General Assembly that will implement cost savings measures by lowering the income level for initial eligibility for child care benefits.

WHEREAS, Sections 5104.011, 5104.30, 5104.34, 5104.38 and 5104.42 of the Ohio Revised Code authorize the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services (ODJFS) to promulgate rules relating to the administration of the publicly funded child care program.

WHEREAS, Section 119.03(F) of the Ohio Revised Code authorizes the Governor, upon the request of a state agency, to determine that an emergency exists necessitating the immediate adoption, amendment, or rescission of an agency rule.


WHEREAS, ODJFS has requested a determination whether an emergency exists that requires the immediate amendment of Rules 5101:2-16-30 and 5101:2-16-39 of the Ohio Administrative Code in order for ODJFS, pursuant to Sections 5104.011, 5104.30, 5104.34, 5104.38 and 5104.42 of the Ohio Revised Code, to make changes to the rules that increase the income eligibility standards to meet the 2011 federal poverty levels (FPL); to lower the income-eligibility level for child care benefits and define categories of authorization that simplify the eligibility and authorization process; and, to adjust the copayment amounts based on the 2011 FPL.

NOW THEREFORE, I, John R. Kasich, Governor of the State of Ohio, have determined, upon the request of ODJFS, that an emergency exists requiring the immediate amendment of Rules 5101:2-16-30 and 5101:2-16-39 of the Ohio Administrative Code by ODJFS. Further, I hereby order that the procedures prescribed by Section 119.03 of the Ohio Revised Code with respect to the amendment of such specified rules be suspended and ODJFS be permitted to immediately amend these rules by electronically filing them with the Secretary of State, the Director of the Legislative Service Commission, and the Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review.

Further, I hereby order that this Executive Order be filed in electronic form with ODJFS, the Secretary of State, the Director of the Legislative Service Commission, and the Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review.

I signed this Executive Order on June 30, 2011 in Columbus, Ohio and it will expire at the end of the ninetieth day it is in effect.
