KASICH SIGNS TWELVE BILLS INTO LAW

COLUMBUS—Today Gov. John R. Kasich signed the following pieces of legislation into law:

Sub. SB 23 (Beagle, Burke) reforms Ohio laws regarding adoption records;

Am. HB 177 (Pelanda) prohibits the manufacture, import or sale of a counterfeit or nonfunctional motor vehicle that causes the vehicle's diagnostic system to inaccurately indicate that the vehicle is equipped with a functional air bag, and increases the penalty for improper replacement of a motor vehicle air bag if the violation results in bodily injury or death;

Am. Sub. SB 200 (Uecker) reforms Ohio voter registration law;

Am. Sub. SB 206 (Burke, Cafaro) requires implementation of certain Medicaid revisions, reform systems, and program oversight, and makes an appropriation;

Sub. HB 83 (Hackett) modernizes Ohio's psychology and school psychology licensing law;

Am. SB 68 (Schaffer) makes changes to the Architecture Board and its activities;

Sub. HB 147 (Patmon, Wachtmann) requires a surgeon performing a mastectomy, lymph node dissection, or lumpectomy in a hospital to guide the patient and provide referrals in accordance with the standards of the National Accreditation Program for Breast Centers and names this act the "Lizzie B. Byrd Act;"

SB 201 (Bacon) authorizes the conveyance of state-owned real estate in Franklin County to Step by Step Academy, Inc.;

Am. Sub. HB 311 (Retherford, Boose) clarifies the effective date of an income tax deduction, extends the availability of a corporation franchise tax credit, and clarifies that a person eligible for the homestead exemption without income limits continues to receive that exemption if the person's homestead changes;

Sub. HB 126 (Kunze, Stinziano) reforms Ohio power of attorney and living will law;

Am. Sub. HB 23 (Gonzales) creates the "Ovarian Cancer Awareness" license plate and makes corrections to specified memorial highway designations;

Am. SB 137 (Patton) requires motor vehicle operators to take certain actions upon approaching a highway maintenance vehicle and repeals the version of section 4511.01 of the Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect on January 1, 2017.
